Article III (B)(2)	Dues/Donations	Members may be requested to make a voluntary donation of <u>\$25.00</u> .	<p>1. Payment of dues is not a prerequisite for participation or membership in the PTA. Article V (E)	Election of Council Selectors	The three mandatory officers of the Association shall be the selectors for the parent members of the Community Education Councils (CECs), the Citywide Council on High Schools (CCHS), and the Citywide Council for District 75 (CCD75), which occurs once every two years. The committee is responsible for fundraising for fifth grade activities, coordination of yearbook, end of year party and graduation ceremony in coordination with school administration.</p> <p>5.
