3rd graders have received their recorders. Thank you for all that submitted \$7. These instruments will stay in school and they will not be shared. For your sanity, if your child has a recorder at home and they are blowing it as loud as they can, remind them that Mr. Ramsingh says, "don't blow out the candle."

4th graders will be learning ukuleles in class. They will have a partner and share 1 ukulele. This instrument has nylon strings and pushing their fingers on it may hurt a bit. This is normal and the more they play they will develop a thicker skin, literally.
